Trade Map: Part of a suite of online market analysis tools developed by the International Trade Centre



Trade Map is an online trade data analysis tool that provides trade flow information in a user-friendly and accessible format. Users in developing countries are granted access to these ITC tools free of charge. Trade Map contains monthly, quarterly and annual international trade data that, combined with statistical indicators, can help users to prioritize export or import markets.

Trade Map enables users to:

- Analyse any country's export performance for any product or service
- ldentify promising export markets, by viewing the world's major importing countries for a specific product and associated growth rates
- ▶ Access the level of competition in a given export market: view competitor countries, the number of supplying countries
- Assess the national trade performance of a country, identify sectors and products in terms of trade and investment potential
- Consider diversification options in a specific market by reviewing demand for similar products in that market
- View and download trade data to better understand short and long term import and export trends for specific products and markets.

To access the ITC online tools, a user must register online using their e-mail and password.



A grower of nuts located in Mozambique receives an enquiry from a nut processor in South Africa for the supply of 'in shell macademia nuts', and decides to do some further market analysis on the South African market.





Product tariff codes & descriptions, trade data for different sub-categories of nuts classified within HS 0802 (HS 080262 - fresh/dried macadamia, shelled)

In this simple example, what was the producer able to establish?

- Mozambique supplies mainly whole (in shell) macadamia nuts to South Africa; exports grew rapidly (by 122%) in the period 2020 to 2021 (to \$6.7m).
- Mozambique is the **leading supplier to** SA, accounting for 50% of SA's total imports in 2021 (2019: 33%)
- SA's imports of 'in shell macadamia nuts' have grown at an average annual rate of more than 50% per year over the decade 2012-2021, to \$13.3m in 2021.
- The data suggests that in recent years there has been some **substitution** of 'in shell macadamia' imports by SA from Malawi and Zimbabwe, to Mozambique
- SA's exports of processed (shelled) macadamia nuts to the country's largest export destination (USA) have doubled to \$100m in the period 2020-2021.
